It is our pleasure to provide you with the 2025 annual report for Hunterdon Health.

It was an exciting year as we continued to grow and meet the demands of our community.

Major renovations were completed at the Dr. Laurence M. Russell, Jr. Campus at Phillips-Barber.

- A new Specialty Suite serves as a shared space for gastroenterology, pulmonary, podiatry, endocrinology, neurology, dermatology and pain management offices.
- A new Medical Imaging Suite offering x-ray, with DEXA scan, mammography, and ultrasound services arriving later this year.
- A physical therapy office will open in 2026.

Our goal is to provide a safe environment for everyone who comes through our doors. To increase the safety and security for our patients, visitors and employees, Hunterdon Health implemented a weapons detection system at the entrance to the hospital and the Emergency Department.

Hunterdon Health also achieved several significant accolades last year:

- Received an "A" Hospital Safety Grade from The Leapfrog Group for the 12th consecutive time.
- Earned The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval® for Advanced Primary Stroke Center Certification and Palliative Care Certification.

## Hunterdon Health Celebrates 2025 Accomplishments

- Hunterdon Health received an “A” Hospital Safety Grade by The Leapfrog Group for patient safety. In 2025, we received our 12th consecutive “A” rating.
- Hunterdon Medical Center earned The Joint Commission’s Gold Seal of Approval® for Advanced Primary Stroke Center Certification by demonstrating continuous compliance with its performance standards. In addition, the organization also earned a Gold Seal for Palliative Care Certification. The Gold Seal is a symbol of quality that reflects a health care organization’s commitment to providing safe and quality patient care.
- Hunterdon Health is proud to be certified™ by Great Place to Work® for the fifth year in a row. This significant recognition is based entirely on what employees say about their experience working for Hunterdon Health.
- The New Jersey Department of Health recognized both Hunterdon Medical Center and the Hunterdon Medical Group practices of Hunterdon Health for their Antimicrobial Stewardship Practices. The Antimicrobial Stewardship Honor Roll Program acknowledges top performers, improves visibility of antimicrobial stewardship programs, and sustains current emphasis on stewardship in the state.
- Hunterdon Medical Center received Press Ganey’s HX Achievement Award in recognition of an over 80% reduction in serious safety event rates, further reinforcing our commitment to achieving and sustaining HRO excellence.
- Renovations have begun to transform Hunterdon Regional Cancer Center into a modern, patient-centered environment designed to support both patients and caregivers.
- Major renovations were completed at the Dr. Laurence M. Russell, Jr. Campus at Phillips-Barber. On the lower level, we added a Specialty Suite which serves as a shared space for our gastroenterology, pulmonary, podiatry, endocrinology, neurology, dermatology and pain management offices. A new Medical Imaging Suite opened on the lower level, offering x-ray, and later this year we will add DEXA scan, mammography, and ultrasound services. In addition, a physical therapy office will open in 2026 in this location.
- Nursing stations were modernized on patient units (3 West and ICU will be completed in 2026). The new stations help to contribute to a positive work environment, improve workflow and enhance communication.
- Hunterdon Health is leading the way in the treatment of lung cancer with the addition of the Ion Robotic Bronchoscopy System from Intuitive.
- The Johnson & Johnson VELYS robot and Stryker Mako robots were purchased to support knee replacements for orthopedic surgery. Both robots use the patient’s exact anatomy to help produce precise bone cuts and ligament balancing, offering the potential for improved patient outcomes and enhanced recovery.
- In an effort to increase the safety and security for our patients, visitors and employees, Hunterdon Health implemented a weapons detection system at the entrance to the hospital and the Emergency Department in November of 2025.
- At Hunterdon Health, our cardiologists are using the latest in AI technology to assess a person’s personal risk – earlier and with the highest precision available – before a cardiac event becomes inevitable. The Cleerly coronary analysis processes images captured in a Cardiac CT exam (CCTA) using artificial intelligence-based algorithms to determine the presence, amount and type of plaque in the arteries.
- Hunterdon Medical Center and The Institute for Advanced Reconstruction were the first healthcare providers on the East Coast to use the Lumicell® Direct Visualization System for breast cancer surgery — a cutting-edge advancement that enables surgeons to detect residual cancer cells in “real time” during surgery.
